The undersigned, having been charged by the Government of the Dominion and the Government of the Province of British Columbia, to represent the said Government in the closing of the sittings of the Royal Commission on Indian Affairs for the Province of British Columbia, to represent the said Government in the supervision of the production, printed and bound, of the Report of the said Commission, and to have custody and control of the papers and records of the said Commission, found, in the discharge of their duties and through an examination of Seabird Island by Mr. Ashdown H. Green, B.C.L.S., the Technical Officer of the Commission, that by reason of a mistaken description set forth in the Minute of the Commission of the 16th March, 1915, reducing the area reserved for certain Indian Bands by the late Mr. Commissioner Sproat within the bounds of Seabird Island, the major portion of the Indian improvements thereon would be cut off contrary to the intention of the Commission in the matter.

They thereupon conferred with Mr. J. P. Shaw, who had been a member of said Commission, and after discussion with him and agreement as to amending the said mistaken description, communicated by wire with Mr. N. W. White, K.C., who was the Chairman of the said Commission, and Mr. Saumarez Carmichael, K.C., who was a member thereof, and they by telegraph expressed agreement to amendment, the telegrams to them and their replies being placed herewith.

The undersigned, therefore, impressed with a full sense of the responsibility attaching to them, and with a view to preventing injury to the Indians of Seabird Island through the mistaken description, respectfully recommend that for the description in the Minute of the Commission respecting Seabird Island of the 16th March, 1915, the following description prepared by Mr. Ashdown H. Green, B.C.L.S., be substituted when the Report of the Commission is being passed upon by Your Excellency in Council and Your Honour in Council:—

"All that portion of Seabird Island in Township Four (4), Range Twenty-eight (28), West of the 6th Meridian, comprising Sections Four (4) and Ten (10), and those portions of Sections Three (3) and Eleven (11) lying to the West of the Fraser River, and containing Sixteen Hundred and Ninety (1690) acres, more or less, according to attached Plan."
